of Byzantine aesthetics: Cappadocian thinking and the holy images of Byzantine Cappadocia

The lecture will discuss Byzantine aesthetics with reference to the three fourth-century Cappadocian Church fathers' notions of *divine* and *human*. It will focus on how Byzantine holy images/eikons reveal the notion of *perichoresis* in the sense of reciprocity and coinherence of divine and human in Jesus Christ and the holy drama, and of interpenetration of the three divine Persons, *hypostaseis* of Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

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She is the author of Byzantine holy images and the issue of transcendence and immanence (2005) and The theological background of the Late Byzantine Palaiologan iconography and aesthetics of the Chora Church, Istanbul (forthcoming at Peeters).
